

 - FWPD Personnel (all ranks sworn and civilian)




Accreditation Updates








-  2016 homicides result of a range of motives including:
 - Seven domestic cases (20%)
 - Six argument/fight cases (17%)
 - Six drug related cases (17%)
 - Five unknown cases (14%)
 - Four gang-related cases (11%)
 - Four individual robbery cases (11%)
 - Two business robbery cases (6%)
 - One unclassified case (3%)
-  25 cases involved firearms
-  **73% of suspects have criminal histories and 60% of victims had criminal histories**








