Graffiti Goes Green

The Graffiti-Going Green Project offers an opportunity for individuals and groups to volunteer with a unique eco-friendly approach in Fort Worth. Volunteers play a crucial role in combatting graffiti by planting ivy against heavily tagged walls, primarily within parks and similar locations. The objective of this initiative is to encourage the growth of ivy up the walls, acting as a natural deterrent to graffiti and enhancing the aesthetic appeal of the community. By reducing the defacement of both private and public property, this project contributes to making Fort Worth an even more beautiful place to live.

Volunteers participating in this project can expect to engage in outdoor activities, with duties including site preparation and planting starter ivy. Depending on the project's location and size, additional plants or flowers may be planted to beautify the surroundings. Participants should anticipate a 2 to 3-hour shift and are required to be comfortable with outdoor work. If under the age of 16, volunteers must be accompanied by an adult. They should also be prepared for potentially handling heavy materials such as shovels and dirt.

REQUIREMENTS

- Comfortable with outdoor activities.
- May need to carry heavy materials like shovels.
- Closed-toed shoes and gardening attire are required.
- Some projects may require transportation for site visits.
