



The City of Fort Worth continues to monitor Coronavirus (COVID-19) and implement various preparedness and precautionary efforts.

The Office of Emergency Management, in coordination with all City departments, is monitoring the situation daily, reviewing contingency plans, and implementing preparedness efforts to ensure the safety and health of all Fort Worth employees and residents.
