### Findings

The Central Library currently utilizes about three quarters of the space available within the total building, indicating there is sufficient expansion space on-site to meet future needs. Given the urban location, the site is adequate, but additional parking should be acquired in close proximity to the building.

The Central Library ranks first in contacts per capita despite serving the entire city. Central also ranks first in operational cost efficiency, due to the large size of the facility. Central ranks in the bottom third in all other usage criteria, however, facility size creates anomalies when compared to branch Libraries.

### Recommendations

Reconfigure interior spaces prescribed in Appendix Five, over three Phases. Phase One should minimize capital costs in favor of “sweat equity” projects that can be performed by City staff, in preparation for Phases Two and Three. Extend the hours of operation to 54 by 2012, to 64 when Phase Two is completed, and to 70 when Phase Three is completed.
