## Meacham Airport Aaron Barth

- ➤ Mid-Field Redevelopment Project
  - o Meacham has a waiting list for hangars with commitments.
  - o Construction on the utility corridor is nearing completion. Once this portion is completed, construction on the road portion will then begin.
  - o This portion will be replacing and extending Commander Road into the new redevelopment area and installing the required utility lines.
  - The goal is to have parcel sites ready for developers to easily tie into the road and main utility lines once completed.

## ➤ Airport Master Plan Update

- Has begun and is progressing, and we are looking forward to wrapping it up next year.
- O Coffman and Associates conducted public meetings in June and November that were well received.

- This is a long-range plan that takes a holistic view of airport and community trends and is conducted by consultants that specialize in this field.
- o This effort takes approximately 12 to 18 months to complete.

## Spinks Airport Joe Hammond

#### West Side Box Hangar Construction

- O Contractors broke ground June 17th with expected completion to occur in January/February which will include:
  - Construction of a new group 1 hangar access taxi-lane on the west side of Spinks Airport.
  - Construction of a 12-unit box hangar. Each unit will be approximately 3,400 square feet.

## ➤ West Side Fence Replacement

- o Removal and replacement of 3/4 mile of failing/overgrown fence line between the air traffic control tower and Fire Station 42.
- Include with fence install a concrete base that will double as a mow strip and wildlife barrier.
- O Increase safety, improve aesthetics, decrease maintenance requirements, and provide a subgrade barrier to prevent/reduce wildlife from burrowing under the fence.

## Alliance Airport Lauren Spence

## ➤ Gulfstream Aerospace Corporation MRO Facility

- As of August 31, plans and specifications were completed and taxilane construction bids opened on Thursday October 7.
- Construction is currently underway, with the facility operable by the spring of 2022.

## Amazon Environmental Assessment Mitigation Phase

- Currently working with homeowners to determine their chose of mitigation options.
- Posting open house to provide homeowners an opportunity to see options for noise mitigation.
- Information presented to possibly effected homeowners included: study/construction schedules, possible mitigation options and how the process will be conducted.
- The first round of noise testing was completed in early February 2021, and the second round occurred in June.

## > Part 150 Update

- o CP&Y and AECOM are addressing comments that the FAA has provided in response to the final submittal and are re-submitting.
- O A virtual public meeting was held on April 29, 2021 to introduce the Part 150 Noise Exposure Map (NEM) Update. This meeting provided an opportunity for the public to provide comments on both the NEM update and the 2025 Future Conditions NEM. Once the update is accepted by the FAA, the new noise contours for Fort Worth Alliance Airport will be finalized and published.

## > Taxiway Papa Extension

- o Amazon is anxious to get the benefit of a second access point of 16R
- Work is underway and is a critical project that will create a safer operating environment for all users by reducing dual runway crossings by west side users of the airport.
- o Excavation has been done, bringing this worksite to field elevation.
- All outstanding work for Phase 1 is scheduled to be completed by mid-November 2021.
- A sixty (60) day closure of RWY 16R/34L will enable construction crews to complete concrete and electrical work on the newlyconstructed portions of TWY P that are located within the runway safety

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Aviation Advisory Board recommends that the City Council:

- 1. Authorize the application for and acceptance of the Fiscal Year 2022 Cargo Entitlement Grant, if awarded, from the Federal Aviation Administration, in an amount up to \$2,222,222.00 for airport lighting, joint and pavement improvements, a pavement management report, and the extension of Taxiway Papa at City of Fort Worth Alliance Airport; and
- 2. Authorize the use of land credits or cash match in an amount up to \$277,778.00, for the City's inkind local match of the project cost.

#### **DISCUSSION**

Each year the City of Fort Worth Alliance Airport (Airport) is eligible to receive Airport Cargo Entitlement funds from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) based on the amount of cargo activity from the previous calendar year and discretionary dollars available in the Airport Improvement Program (AIP). The total amount of entitlement funds being applied for this year is \$2,500,000.00.

The Fiscal Year 2022 Cargo Entitlement grant will be used for, but not be limited to, the following projects:

- Design, construction and construction oversight for the resealing of pavement joints and miscellaneous pavement repairs at various locations on the Airport;
- Construction for the rehabilitation of taxiway centerline lighting;
- Creation of a Pavement Management Report to determine the pavement conditions at various locations on the Airport; and
- Design for the continued extension of Taxiway Papa;

Existing land credits remaining from land donations at City of Fort Worth Alliance Airport will be used for the City's in-kind match of \$277,778.00. If land credits are not available, a cash match will be used.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Aviation Advisory Board recommends that the City Council:

- 1. Authorize the application for and acceptance of a Noise Mitigation Grant, if awarded, from the Federal Aviation Administration, in an amount up to \$1,976,495.00 for noise mitigation efforts at City of Fort Worth Alliance Airport; and
- 2. Authorize the use of land credits or cash match, in an amount up to \$219,611.00, for the City's in-kind local match of the project cost.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) has issued over \$19,000,000 in grant funding during the 2019, 2020 and 2021 fiscal years for the Noise Mitigation project (Project) at City of Fort Worth Alliance Airport (Airport). The 2022 grant, if awarded, will be for the final portion of the noise mitigation efforts included in this Project. Any funding not used will be returned to the FAA.

The first phase of the Project included an in-depth study of homes in the Rivers Edge neighborhood, which determined 264 homes are eligible for noise mitigation efforts.

Five methods for noise mitigation will be offered to the homeowners. These methods include a sound insulation program, sales assurance program, transaction assistance program, and purchase assurance program, all with an associated avigation easement, as well as an avigation easement program. The choice of the sound insulation program, which is most common in this project, will consist of the installation of new windows and doors. The choice of purchase assurance, sales assurance, or transaction assurance are measures with which to assist homeowners who prefer to move from the noise impacted areas and facilitate a timely market sale of noise impacted properties.

This grant, if awarded, would be in the amount up to \$1,976,495.00. Existing land credits remaining from land donations at the Airport will be used for the City's in-kind match of \$219,611.00. If land credits are not available, a cash match will be used.

## Meacham Airport

#### Mid-Field Redevelopment Project

Construction on the utility corridor for the midfield redevelopment project is nearing completion. Construction of the road portion has begun and progress is ongoing. This portion of the Mid-Field Project will be replacing and extending Commander Road into the new redevelopment area and installing the required utility lines along the road. The goal is to have parcel sites ready for developers to easily tie into the road and utility lines once it is completed.

## Airport Master Plan Update

The Master Plan process at Meacham Airport is progressing. Coffman and Associates conducted a public meeting in June, and another the beginning of November and it was well received. The next planning/public meeting will take place sometime in the spring. The Airport Master Plan is a long-range plan that takes a holistic view of airport and community trends and is conducted by consultants that specialize in this field. The last plan was conducted in 2004 and is typically updated every 10-15 years. This effort takes approximately 12 to 18 months to complete.

## **Spinks Airport**

#### **West Side Box Hangar Construction**

Contractors broke ground June 17th, with the expected completion to occur in January/February.

The West side box hangar construction project consists of:

- Construction of a new group 1 hangar access taxi-lane on the west side of Spinks Airport.
- Construction of a 12-unit box hangar. Each unit will be approximately 3,400 square feet.

## **Alliance Airport**

#### **Gulfstream Aerospace Corporation MRO Facility**

Construction is underway for Gulfstream's new 160,000 square foot Maintenance, Repair, and Overhaul (MRO) service center located on private property at the east end of TWY H and is scheduled to be completed by spring of 2022. Concrete paving for the new adjoining taxilane between Gulfstream and TWY H is scheduled to begin mid-January 2022.

## Amazon Environmental Assessment Mitigation Phase

The Public Meetings (virtual) for this project occurred on January 12-13, 2021 and included the following information which was presented to possibly affected homeowners: study/construction schedules, possible mitigation options and how the process will be conducted. The first construction bid phase began on November 30, 2021 and included five (5) affected homes in the Rivers Edge subdivision and the final noise testing was completed in early December 2021. The findings determined that all homes in the Rivers Edge subdivision qualify for sound insulation, which was approved by the FAA. Homeowner outreach meetings and contractor informational and training meetings began on November 9, 2021 and are on-going.

## Part 150 Update

The Part 150 Update, which began January 2019, was approved by the FAA on December 23, 2021. As of January 3, 2022, information regarding the Part 150 Noise Exposure Map Update was published in the FAA Federal Register.

## Taxiway Papa Extension

The Taxiway Papa Extension is underway and is a critical, multiphase project that will create a safer operating environment for all users by reducing dual runway crossings by west side users of the airport. Phase II work, which is located between the newly completed Phase I area at TWY E and the existing TWY P at the TWY D intersection, is currently being prepared for lime treatment and concrete pouring. A fifty (50) day runway closure of RWY 16R/34L is tentatively scheduled for mid-March 2022 to enable the Mario Sinacola & Sons construction crews to complete demo, the pour of new concrete, and all associated electrical work on the Phase II area within the runway safety area. All outstanding work is scheduled to be completed by the end of April 2022.
