## **CORNERSTONE INITIATIVES...SO FAR**

#### Fort Worth's Main Street Pilot Program

- Two business corridors will take part in the city's first pilot program with Main Street America, a proven national leader in the revitalization of commercial districts at other major U.S. cities.
- Those districts are **Historic Northside**, whose managing organization is the Fort Worth Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, and **Polytechnic**, whose managing organization is Southeast Fort Worth, Inc. with strong support from Texas Wesleyan University.
- Over the next three years, each corridor will receive training from Main Street America to produce
  a customized transformation strategy, funding to hire a full-time community-focused staff person
  dedicated to implementing the strategy, and funds to begin work on projects identified through the
  strategy. This investment is meant to create place-based organization and programming to drive
  visible projects and redevelopment, and leverage additional private funding locally and nationally
  to generate momentum and support to these up-and-coming neighborhoods.

- The Advancing East Lancaster and East Berry Corridor plans are just the first of Fort Worth's new transit-oriented redevelopment plans. These plans will take a holistic approach to reimagining and aligning policies around equity, Smart-City infrastructure, catalytic development and more.
- Historically, transit investments like rail have been the key to spurring new development and opportunity in Fort Worth, and the City and its partners are interested in exploring at new modes of transit, like electric vehicles (EV) to better connect people to opportunities throughout the region and create greater quality of life and sense of place for the city's neighborhoods.
