Established in 2022, the Historic Northside District is a Main Street America pilot project, led by the Fort Worth Hispanic Chamber of Commerce in partnership with the City of Fort Worth. The initiative focuses on revitalizing the Northside's unique cultural and commercial corridor by fostering equitable economic development, supporting local businesses, and enhancing the area's historic and cultural assets.

Through a community-driven approach, the Historic Northside District aims to preserve its rich cultural heritage while promoting sustainable growth, improving streetscapes, and creating opportunities for business incubation.

ORGANIZATION

- Board and Committees: Recruited fourteen board members representing diverse community stakeholders. Began a board leadership nomination process ensuring our organization has the capacity to drive long-term revitalization efforts.
- Volunteers: Recruited over fifty volunteers, who contributed over 400 hours of donated time. Value of volunteer donations equal \$12,720 in volunteer time per 2024 estimates.
- Partnerships: Created new partnerships, including with the Urban Land Institute, the Latino Cultural Project, Northside
 Community Group, Northside Inter-Community Agency, Community
 Design Fort Worth, Cerebro Sano,
 Suvida Healthcare, Frost Bank,
 Rodeo Dental, and the Cowtown
 Marathon. and Transfom 1012.

ECONOMIC VITALITY

- Grants: Selected as a recipient of a \$5,000 grant from the Fort Worth Tourism Public Improvement District administered by Arts Fort Worth.
- Sponsorship: Raised a total of \$42,500 through sponsorships for 2024 Sonidos Del Summer Series.
 Sponsors included Cerebro Sano, a program of the James L West Center for Dementia Care, Gorrondona & Associates, Telemundo39 / NBC 5, Arca Continental Coca-Cola Southwest Beverages, the Rios Group, Trinity Metro, Frost, QT, SuVida Healthcare, Joe T. Garcia's, NBT Financial, Rodeo Dental, the Fort Worth Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, and the Boys and Girls Club.
- Revenue: Generated over \$12,000 in revenue through food vendors, artisan vendors, and community partner exhibitors. Revenue was

DESIGNING A FUTURE ROOTED IN CULTURE AND COMMUNITY

This year, the Main Street project took a slightly different approach due to staff transitions, prioritizing education and laying the groundwork for future initiatives. The team concentrated on building a foundational understanding of zoning, design, and land use concepts.

Multiple Zoning 101 workshops were offered, equipping residents and stakeholders with the knowledge of how zoning and design impacts the district and daily life. These sessions empowered our community with tools to both preserve and uplift the district, protecting its cultural heritage in the process.

Additionally, through a partnership with the Texas Rangers, we inaugurated a vibrant new mural on N Main Street, further showcasing our dedication to enhancing the district's cultural landscape. In tandem with these efforts, we hosted an UrbanPlan for Communities workshop that engaged local leaders and residents in a handson real estate development simulation. Participants explored the complexities of land use, learning how to balance affordable housing, commercial growth, and public amenities. The Urban Land Institute's Advisory Services Panel (ASP) will further enrich this work by bringing in national experts to assess the potential impacts of neighboring development in our community.

We also partnered with Community Design Fort Worth to facilitate a conversation on equitable development in neighboring Panther Island. This dialogue, along with cultural initiatives like the Sonidos Del Summer series and our partnership with the TCU Maestro program for the revitalization of Marine Skate Park, highlights our holistic approach. By combining educational programming, public art, and placemaking events, we continue to foster community pride and ownership while ensuring that Northside remains a culturally rich and dynamic district for generations to come.
